# Computer Department:-

The achievements of Computer Department are:-

- 1. Neha Jain of B.Sc.-I stood first in University.
- 2. Aarti Dhingra of BCA-I stood second in Punjabi University and Moninder Singh stood fourth.
- 3. 24 students of BCA-I and 11 students of B.Sc.-I secured first divisions which is a matter of great pride for the college.
- 4. The result of BCA-I and B.Sc.-I of the department was the best in the city of Patiala.
- 5. During the year 2001-02, for the first time in Patiala, UGC gave approval to the computer department of Khalsa College to start Vocationalisation of Education Scheme as the major subject of Computer Applications. This subject is being taught to B.Com.-I by the department under this scheme. A grant of 17 lakh rupees to the college was approved by UGC.
- 6. Under the above scheme, there is a possibility that UGC will give approval to start other vocational subjects like Information Technology and Computer Maintenance during 2002-2003. The correspondence is being done with the UGC and after the approval the college will get grant of Rs. 34 lakhs.
- 7. There is a plan to start two more units (30 seats each) of PGDCA during evening session in the department. For this purpose, College is in close touch with Punjabi University Patiala. After the approval is accorded, the students on one hand will get recognized diploma's and college will earn approximate income of Rs. 9 lakhs on other hand.
- 8. During the academic session 2002, the third lab of computer department has got ready. Prof. Kirpal Singh Badungar, Head of Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee inaugurated it on 6<sup>th</sup> February. With the starting of this lab, the department has the facility of three labs. In these labs, there are around 50 best computers and around 10 printers.

Gurmat Society:- A Guramat Society has ben formed under the leadership of Mrs. Barinder Kaur head, Department of Religion to perform religious activities and its members were elected on 18-10-2001. Preet Mohinder Singh was made the head of Gurmat Society. From 24<sup>th</sup> Dec., to 26 Dec., 2001, 16 students of the college took part in Sikh Virsa Preservation Conference at Shri Amritsar. On 19-1-2002, in connection with Guru Nanak Dev's Prakash Utsav, students took part in the Nagar Kirtan. On 7-2-2002. Sri Gobind Singh's Prakash Utsav was celebrated with great reverence. After the completion of Sahej Paath, the students sang shabads also. The chief guest of this programme Prof. Kirpal Singh Badungar threw light on the teaching of Guru Gobind Singh. After the programme, langar was served to all.

On 8-2-2002, two students Gurpreet Singh of B.A.I and Mr. Simran Singh of B.A.III took part in Inter College declamation contest held at Gurmat College, Patiala.

In the college, on every Sangrand, Shabad-Kirtan is performed by the students of music department and after the completion of Sahej Paath of the teachings of Shri Guru Granth Sahib, Sahej Paath is started again. In order to relate students to gurmat, they are taught Gurbani path and made aware of the aims of gurmat in the fourth period.

Guru Gobind Singh Study Circle: Under the supervision of Mr. Tarlocahn Singh Mahajan and Mr. Ravinderjeet Singh, this unit was established. On 10 Nov., 2001, this unit organized a seminar by Dr. Gurcharan Singh (Secretary Academy of Sikh Religion and Culture) on the contribution of Shri Guru Granth Sahib to humanity. He told the students and the teachers that the knowledge of Guru Granth Sahib helps in improving the society by stressing on the concept of unity in diversity. On 10<sup>th</sup> Nov., 2001, Mr. Mahajan showed a slide show related to Gurmat and science. With the help of Guru Arjan Kirtan Mandal, Guru Gobind Singh Study Circle organized a Story-writing competition all the colleges of Punjab. In its connection on 24, January, 2002, a function was organized at college campus in which Sr. Tarlochan Singh Jeet (Chief Guru Arjan Kirtan Mandal) and other famous intellectuals participated. Mr. Tarlochan Singh Mahajan read the mini stories. Mr. Satinder Singh Kahlon told precisely about mini stories. One gurmat tour was organized to Kirtpur Sahib, Riwaalsar Sahib and Manikaran Sahib. Mr. Jatinder Singh Bhutal supervised this tour.

**Talent Hunt:** A talent hunt was organized in the college in which students took part with a great zeal in poetry recitation, debate, song, ghazal, folk song, histrionics etc.

Cultural Activities:- under the supervision of Ms. Maljinder Kaur the college participated in 27 items in Zonal Youth Festival at Bikram College of Commerce, Patiala from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> Jan. The college stood first in debate, Vaar Gaayan, Painting competition, collage, Clay modeling and second in Gidha, Bhangra, Orchestra, group song, elocution, poster making, costume parade, drama, histrionics, group skit, Rangoli. The college got overall third position. On 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2002 in the inter-zonal competition, held at Punjabi University, Navdeep Kaur (PGDCA) got first position On the Spot Painting competition, Gurinderpreet Singh of B.A.I Collage, Simran Singh of B.A.III took part in debate and stood first and won gold medals. Talwinder Singh won second position in the Clay Moulding competition, Harjasmeet Kaur and Rajwinder Kaur also won second position in Vaar Gaayan competition and won Silver Medals. For these achievements, Ms. Kamal Sohal, Dr. Deepinderjeet Randhawa, Dr. Gurdish Kaur Bajwa. Ms. Sukhmeet Kaur, Ms. Jasleen Kaur and Ms. Paramjeet Kaur (Commerce) deserve special congratulations. Jaswinder Singh of B.A.III was selected for the University Bhangra team.

Under the leadership of Mr. Kanwaljeet Singh and Mr. Kuldeep Kumar, the students of Music department stood first in the inter college Shabad Kirtan competition held at Sikh Religion Academy, Patiala and won the trophy. At Guru Hargobind Khalsa College Gurusar Sadhaar, an inter-college Shabad Kirtan competition was organised where the boy's team stood first in group singing and girl's team got the consolation prize. Overall, they secured first position.

In the inter college Shabad Kirtan competition held at Akaal Degree College Mastuana Sahib, the college team won consecutively for the third time and won Giani Arjan Singh Memorial Running Trophy. In inter college competitions held at Mata Ganga Khalsa College, the college stood first in Vaar Gaayan and in second position in Shabad Gayan on Nirdharit Raags (prescribed).

In order to make the students aware of the works and contribution of old, great Ustaad singers and their struggles Ustaad K.P.S. Raahi gave a lecture and was introduced to the students in the Music department under the new series "Sunad".

Punjabi Department: On 1<sup>st</sup> Nov., 2001. Punjab Day was celebrated by the Punjabi department and a poetry competition was also held. The students who stood first second and third were given prizes. Mr. Satinder Singh Kahlon, the head of Punjabi department, at that time told the students about the development of Punjabi Language. On 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2002, Saraswati Award winner Dr. Dalip Kaur Tiwana had a Ru-B-Ru with the students and she was honoured by the college. Dr. Charanjit Kaur informed the students about the personal life and literary career of Dr. Tiwana. Due to the efforts of Dr. Charanjit Kaur and Dr. Gurdish Kaur, this function was a great success. This function was dedicated to International Women's Day.

NCC (Army Wing):- During session 2001-02, 28 cadets in the first year, 20 in second and 7 in the third year were recruited. Two cadets went to Gujarat on All India Trekking Expedition. 5 Cadets attended the Army attachment camp at Sangrur. NCC officer captain Jaswant Singh and five cadets attended NIC at Nagar Kwaail, Tamil Nadu. During this session, 5 Pb. BN NCC announced S.U.O. Ranjit Singh Kharoud as the best cadet. The government gave him a cash prize of Rs. 3000 rupees. The college cadets took part in Republic Day Parade at Patiala and in this parade. 5 Pb. Bn NCC secured the first position. Two cadets of the college took 'B' certificate and 7 took 'C' certificate paper. The NCC officer of the college has passed the courses Bravo grade for next promotion.

NCC (Air Wing):- The incharge of the wing is Pilot Officer Gurmeet Singh. The student of BCA-III, Sukhjeet Singh was chosen the Senior Cadet Under Officer of Patiala and Gurpreet Singh, the student of BCA-I was chosen the Cadet Under Officer. Gurpreet Singh secured A grade in NCC (B Grade) paper. 13 students of the college took B certificate paper.

Youth Club: Under the guidance of Mr. Jaswant Singh, Mr. Gurmeet Singh and Dr. Deepinderjeet Randhawa, a Youth Club was established in which Preet Mohinder Singh of B.A.-III was chosen the chief and Harmanpreet Singh of B.A.II was chosen the secretary and in addition to it, a working committee was also made. The club orgnised three tours went to Manikaran Sahib, Manaali, Dehradoon, Mussorie, Jaipur, Agra, Fatehpar Sikri etc. and other historical places.

Grewal bagged two gold and 1 silver medal. Both these students have been selected for All India Camp. Harjot Singh won the gold medal in National names held at Ludhiana.
- 4. Marshal Arts:- Amit Gautam of B.A.I stood third in Marshal Art at national level.
- 5. Volleyball: Woman's team stood third in the inter college Volleyball competition Manpreet Kaur of B.A. II participated in All India Inter University and the team got third position. This student was chosen for Junior India Camp.
- 6. Corfball:- Our team of Corfball participated in Inter college competition.
- 7. Softball: The team of softball took part in inter college competition and Harpreet Singh has been chosen for Punjabi University Camp.
- 8. Cross-Country: The students of the college participated in cross country competitions and Gurpal Singh of B.A.I has been chosen for Punjabi University Camp.
- 9. The college's women hockey team took part in inter college competition. Four students have been selected for the university team and they participated in inter university competition and stood second in All India Inter University Competition.
- Judo :- Pawan Kumar of B.A.I stood first and Sanjay Kumar of B.A.II stood second in inter college competition.

- 11. Gymnastics:- Khalsa College's team participated in Inter-college competition and secured overall third position.
- 12. Boxing:- College's team participated in inter college competition and Kamaldeep Dutta of B.A.I stood third and got selected for university camp.
- 13. Cricket:- Men's Cricket team of the college won the zone in inter college competition and secured fourth position. Hemant preet Singh of BCA-III has been chosen for University camp. Ved Prakash of B.A.I has been chosen for Junior National Cricket team. It is noteworthy that this student has also captained the Punjab team.
- 14. Cricket (Women):- our student Anudeep Kaur participated in inter college women's team competition. She has also been chosen for Punjabi University Camp.
- 15. Power Lifting:- Amit Kumar of B.A.I stood first in inter college power lifting competition. Harbans Singh of 10+2 Arts stood second. Amit Kumar and Deepak Kumar have been selected for University Camp. They stood overall second in the Championship.
- 16. Body Building:- Vinod Kumar of B.A.-I stood first, Gaurav Kumar of B.A.II stood second. Amit Kumar secured first position in body building.
- 17. Weight Lifting:- Jatinder Singh Chauhan secured first and Gurpreet Singh second position in weight lifting competition. Kaanir Singh of B.A.I stood third (Bronze medal) Jatinder Chauhan secured second position in Al India Inter University.
- 18. Athletics:- Sarabjeet Singh, Maha Singh and Bikramjit Singh stood first in inter college Athletics competition. Maha Singh secured second position in Triple Jump. Birkaran Singh secured first position in hammer throw in All India Inter University Competition. In all India inter university competition Maha Singh secured first position in long jump and third position in high jump. Maha Singh has been selected for the camp at NIS started for the preparation of Senior Asia.
- Basketball:- College's team stood third in Inter-college competition. It is worth mentioning that Desh Raj and Wasim have represented India at Junior Asian Basketball Championship. Desh Raj has been adjudged as the promising player of Asia.

20. Hockey (Men):- Hockey team of the college took part in inter college competition Upinder Bir Singh of B.A.I roll no. 420 stood first in relay race at Punjab National games, secured first position in Junior State 400 meters hurdle race, third place in Junior National 400 meters hurdle race. Ms. Harmeet Kaur Grewal and Mr. Gursharan Singh Gill deserve the credit for these achievements.

Annual Games: Annual games were held on 28<sup>th</sup> Feb., and 1<sup>st</sup> March on the grounds of college. On the first day, honourable Sr. Joginder Singh Panjrath member Committee Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandak Committee inaugurated the games and on the second day honourable Prof. Kirpal Singh Badungar, Head, Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandak Committee distributed prizes to the students. For the year 2001-02, Davinder Singh B.A.I Rollno 428 and Sandeep Kaur of B.A.I Rollno. 754 were chosen best athletes among girls among boys and girls respectively.

# Science Association:-

- 1. On 11th Feb, under the supervision of the members of Science Association, Ms. Sukhmeet Kaur (Convener), Mr. Gurdarshan Singh, Mr. Kuldeep Singh, Mr. Sarabjeet Singh Bhatia, Mr. Vikram Gupta, CMS company came to college campus and gave knowledge to the students about the enterance tests of MCA and MBA.
- On 16th Feb, under the responsibility of members of Science Association for imparting knowledge to the students about internet and internal parts, the students were taken to the computer center where they were told about internet and the usage of parts used in computers.
- 3. On 21st, Feb, the famous company S.T.G. was invited to college campus for seminar. They told the students about Placement in computers, the influence of Computer Network on employment and about Microsoft Network Computer Course.
