A U.G.C. (Sponsored on the job Training) workshop was held for students related to Vocational subject during this session in which the students exhibited a lot of interest. A comprehensive knowledge regarding the following major subjects was given in this workshop:

## **Gurmat Society**

## N.S.S.

During this year, under the innovation of Programme Officer Kamal Sohal, two hundred and thirty seven boys, one hundred and thirty two girls got admission in the three units of N.S.S. Prof. Kamal Sohal, Prof. Nishan Singh and Prof. Gagandeep Singh are the main persons associated with it.

Under their mentorship, five one-day camps and three two hourly meetings were organised. During that time, trees and branches were beautified through painting and the work of cleaning the college campus was undertaken with a great vitality.

Seven students of the college took part in Hiking Trekking Camp at Manali from 18th June to 27th June, 2003. Four students of the college - Ramandeep Kaur, Poonam Atri, Raakhi and Ramanjot Singh attended the Disaster Mitigation Workshop at Chandigarh under the guidance of Prof. Kamal Sohal from 29th September, 2003 to 1st October, 2003. This was the

# **Commerce Association**

# **Environment Committee**

A botanical garden of 150×70 square feet was completed under the supervision of Prof. Ambika. Various trees of fruits and flowers have been planted in the garden. Various types of palms, ferns, medicinal plants, aquatic plants and 15-20 types of cactus are also planted there. This process of the plantation is still in progress.

'A Tree Planting Day' was celebrated on 12th Sept., 2003. On the eve of this occasion, S. Gurcharan Singh Tohra (President S.G.P.C.) and Sh. A.S. Bhatia (A.G.M. State Bank of Patiala) also planted trees in the botanical garden and in the campus itself. The committee members, college Principal, teaching and Non-teaching staff, N.S.S. Students also participated in this event enthusiastically. Plants worth Rs. 10,000/- were given to the college by State Bank of Patiala.

On 29th January, 2004, a lecture was also organised on the Environmental Education by Sh. Bishan Das (Retd. Col.) who is also the advisor of Garden and Environment Society, Patiala. On this occasion students

were motivated to refrain from drugs and to mar this evil from the society.

# **Library**

The library of Khalsa College, Patiala was computerised during the session 2003-04. Approximately 842 new books have been purchased for the library. The total number of books in the library has become 21795 now. 182 students were given complete sets of books on the basis of their financial condition, merit and sports. A new reading room has been built for the members of staff and girls.

# **Health Care Centre**

One doctor has been appointed for providing free servcies to the staff and students. The time for free medical check-up is 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. daily. In Dec., 2003 a General Health Check-Up' was organised. Near about 114 number of students were checked up during this. More than 50% of students were found to be suffering from anaemia, cavity problem and blood pressure. Various other diseases were also diagnosed in the studeths. One week yoga camp was also organised in January under the 'Health Awareness' Programme. 32 girls participated in this camp.

# Population Education Club

Under the guidance of Prof. Rupinder Singh Sodhi, Dr. Pushpinder Kaur, Prof. Navneet Kaur and Prof. Avinash Kaur one lecture was organised
